OPENING PRAYER:

Will led opening prayer.

SPIRITUAL EXERCISE:

Our focus is on hope. Jamie spoke about initiatives involving children in Philipstown. Will expressed hope that Covid and the other causes of disruption are behind us and that we can focus on accelerating work we have begun- welcoming newcomers and longtime parishioners, organizing activities of interest to multi-generations, for example. Fred and Paul also spoke to hope for reconciliation and healing. Sarah pointed to the work of the Music Committee: The organ dedication, the development of a youth choir.

MINUTES:

On Fred's recommendation, an amendment was proposed and approved to change the word "transfer" in the Minutes to "transfers.". [An amended copy of the Minutes was sent to Micki Bless in the Office.]

RECTOR'S REPORT:

Summer camp was successful and we are looking ahead to the fall.

Three parishioners who feel called to special ministry are involved in the discernment process; committees are being formed to work with them.

WARDENS' REPORT:.

Bishop Mary Glasspool will lead a Vestry Retreat on October 29; Will is working with the Bishop to determine the place.

Welcome Back Sunday: Vestry members will be introduced at the 10 o'clock service on September 18. Evening Prayer will resume as will Children's Chapel; the Backpack Blessing will take place.

Kenya Proposal:. The Vestry approved \$9,000.00 for St. James in Kenya; the church has submitted a budget detailing what the money will be used for.

Music Committee: A program is being developed for the Organ Dedication, scheduled for October 2 at 3 p.m.; a reception will follow. The guest organist is Craig Williams, Music

Director, Cadet Chapel, US Military Academy at West Point. Invitations are being prepared; the program will include a list of donors. Jamie stressed the importance of making the folks at the Highlands Choral Society feel welcome and that they should know that the invitation is coming from the Vestry. Sarah reported that she had written to Woody Entrekin, in her message emphasizing the fact that the organ would not exist without his advice and leadership; the Vestry concurred.

The Vestry approved \$6,800.00 plus \$200.00 for supplies for a Youth Choir. Amanda, as rector, will offer Susanne McDonnell a 3-month appointment as youth choir director.

TREASURER'S REPORT

YTD, we are doing better than last year. Typically, larger donations come in at the end of the calendar year, but the Stewardship Committee has been asked to try to encourage spreading out the donations over the year as they focus on fundraising for 2023.

The Investment Committee's report has been passed on to attorney Laurie Sawyer.

By-Laws: The By-Laws, last updated in the mid-1990s, need to be reviewed and possibly updated. Sarah will head the committee which also includes Gabe, Margy, Paul, and Kari Jo. The committee should propose changes, if needed, to the Vestry.

Chris Sandlund will do the Alternative Audit Review of the calendar year 2021.

Fire inspection of campus buildings by the building department resulted in mandates to improve or add exit signs in church and Parish House, as well as other minor changes, including some electrical work in the kitchen area. The first meeting of the St. Philip's Nursery School Committee for the new school year was held on Thursday, September 1.

The major goal this fall is to offer an afternoon program for PK and K GUFS students from 2-4 pm two days a week. There seems to be a distinct possibility that we could offer this program legally.
